

learning environments available to the School. The partnership between Hellesdon High School and industry must be mutually beneficial.

- Wherever possible the School will welcome visitors from the world of work to support and enrich the curriculum.
- Every student is entitled to a period of Work Experience (usually within year 10), with appropriate teacher support and review.
- All teaching staff should have access to Education/Industry INSET. The School will aim to deploy the existing industrial expertise of staff effectively and to use links as a vehicle for staff development.

Responsibilities

Senior Leadership Team (SLT) Link:

- Acting as a central point of contact and coordination for local industry/business.
- Promoting and developing links with local and national industry/business which are beneficial to the School in line with the priorities of the School Development Plan.
- Ensuring that economic and industrial understanding is promoted through staff development and within the curriculum.
- Overseeing the activities of the Work Related Learning Coordinator.

Work Related Learning Coordinator:

- Identifying and assessing suitable work placements for students (including extended college or industrial placements and short term work experience).
- Liaising between identified organisations/students and confirming work placement arrangements.
- Liaising with the Local Authority to ensure work placements are suitably risk assessed.
- Coordinating a review of the effectiveness and success of work placements between the student, organisation and appropriate teacher.
- Reporting to the Governing Body via the SLT link on the overall effectiveness of work placements.

Governors:

- The Governing Body is responsible for monitoring and review of the effective use of links between School and industry, the implementation of the work placement scheme and provision of economic and industrial understanding within the curriculum in line with priorities contained in the School Development Plan.
